Because the setting was so magnificent, we decided to give everyone a break this year with all afternoons off. We expected people to take quiet walks on the bay, we provided for beach golf, private readings in reconciliation, and thought people would take long naps but, you could look anywhere at almost any time and find small groups huddled together, praying and sharing vision.

Friday evening, after the first of many luscious meals provided lovingly by Lydian leaders, Donna Reib and Lisa Mills, we worshiped, introduced each other, took communion and went through a fire tunnel of prayer that turned into a clogged car wash.

The Holy Spirit met with each of us as we prayed together. It was a great start to the week.

Saturday morning, Filmmaker Michael Lienau and his exceptional family, shared with us their story and showed us clips of the Lifelife expedition. (www.yokesandchains.com)

That afternoon totally impromptu, our twenty somethings took the Lienau family underwing, and gave art lessons, racing games, and cartooning.

Saturday evening, Harry Smith from the Christian Renewal Centre in North Ireland, a praying community of Catholics and Protestants, shared on Beam Deep out of Hosea 12. Harry's subject was breaking up the fallow ground removing all the blockages (stones) that prevent harvest. It was a solemn charge. Later that evening, Wayne Nosler and Melody Prout wrote a wonderful jazz piece on the text from Hosea, and Caitlin Beidler, our artist in residence did a large watercolor on the topic.


